## CLASSES

Effective July 1, 2020, in compliance with an agreement between the State of California and BU 1, 3, $4,7,11,15,17,20$, and 21, CalHR approved Special Salary Adjustments for the classes identified in the chart below.

## EMPLOYEES

Effective July 1, 2020, all employees designated E01, E04, R01, R03, R04, R07, R11, R14, R15, R17, R20 and R21 in the following classes shall receive the Special Salary Adjustment, including employees who separated from state service prior to July 1, 2020, and have lump sum payments that extend beyond July 1, 2020. The lump sum payments shall be adjusted to reflect the salary increase below.
